




More than half (57.0%) of the population (36 million) live in 3 provinces.

Mid-year population estimates for South Africa by province, 2025









LP has seen a decreased share of the total population from 11,2% to 10,1% between 2002 and 2025

Change in provincial population proportions, 2002 – 2025















Over the period 2021 to 2026, Limpopo is estimated to have a negative net migration of people (157 692)








Limpopo provides a large share of migrants to GP






GP and WC are the only provinces who are below the national fertility rate of South Africa (2,21). **LP** has the **highest fertility rate at 2,94**.

Total Fertility Rate, by province, 2021 – 2026








In LP, 48,0% of children live with their mother only.








South Africa's economy grew by 0,6% in 2024

Annual GDP growth rate (constant 2015 prices)










Gauteng remains the largest economy, accounting for a third of South African GDP

Percentage contribution to national GDP in 2024, current prices (Total: R7,4 trillion)





LP was the fastest growing economy in 2024 at 0,9% points










In 2024, personal services was the largest industry in Limpopo








LP had an official unemployment rate sitting at 33,0%

Provincial unemployment rates: Official vs Expanded Q2:2025










Over the past ten years, the unemployment rate in LP has generally remained below South Africa's national average, but in the most **recent period, it exceeded the national average**.

Provincial Unemployment Rate














Nationally, most of the income (almost 70%) was earned from work

Average annual household income, 2023








Average annual household income (Rands) in LP is R128 309

Average annual household income (Rands) by province 2023








Percentage distribution of main sources of household income by province, 2024
