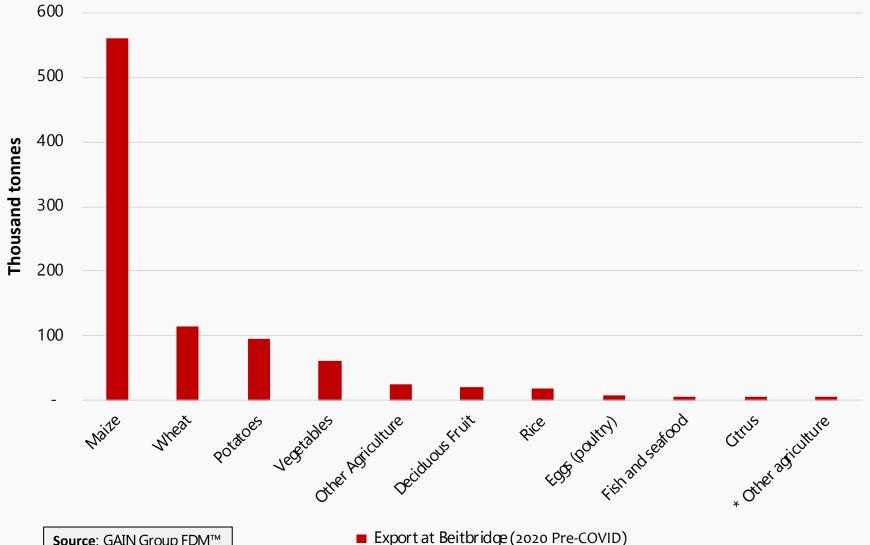

Unlocking Key Levers to Unlock Cross-Border Trade: Limpopo as a Regional Logistics and Hub Distribution

- **1. Efficient Border / Corridor Infrastructure** Ensure fast, predictable movement of goods and people by improving border processes and upgrading key road-rail corridors linking Limpopo to SADC markets.
- **Logistics & Distribution Infrastructure in Limpopo** Develop integrated warehousing, intermodal, cold-chain and staging facilities to position Limpopo as a competitive regional logistics and distribution hub.
- 3. Value-chain & Market Access Alignment Align local production and processing capabilities with regional demand, trade agreements, and AfCFTA rules to increase export readiness and cross-border competitiveness.
- **4. Regulatory & Institutional Enablers** Strengthen policies, customs systems, and cross-agency coordination to remove non-tariff barriers and improve trade facilitation efficiency.
- 5. Financing & Investment Mobilisation Attract blended public-private investment into trade-enabling infrastructure through bankable projects, PPPs, and incentives that unlock economic returns.



SADC + AfCFTA Regional Trade Gateway: Why at Musina

Turn border friction into a competitive advantage by shifting inspections, compliance, and consolidation off the bridge and into Musina, creating South Africa's fastest, most predictable gateway for north-south trade.

- Choosing Musina as the gateway's ground zero is justified because it offers the most potent combination of strategic location, existing infrastructure, corridor alignment, and regional trade potential in Limpopo.
- Convert a congested land border into a programmable gateway at Musina
- By clearing cargo inland, privileging trusted traders, and metering arrivals with digital IDs, Musina deliver time-certain, duty-efficient access to SADC and AfCFTA markets.
- It's a Freight Village with a bonded, regulatory core—backed by Authorised Economic Operator green lanes and rail integration—so shippers get faster passage, lower risk, and broader reach.
- It maximises the value proposition of being a SADC + AfCFTA trade gateway more effectively than other entry points.

Customs Harmonisation and Trade Facilitation in the North-South Corridor

Do-First Provincial Playbook that Limpopo can drive:

- Set up an Inland Border Model at Musina:
 - Bonded pre-clearance zone + inspections inland
- Accelerate Authorised Economic Operator (AEO) uptake:
 - Provincial AEO hands-on support clinics
 - Create 'green-lane' Standard Operating Procedure with SA Revenue Services (SARS) / Border Management Agency (BMA)
- Pilot OSBP-style ops now:
 - Joint inspections & metered truck slots before full OSBP is formalised
- Digitise corridor flows:
 - Enforce pre-arrival filing + integrate with SADC Corridor Trip Monitoring System (CTMS) & SARS Single Window



Customs Harmonisation and Trade Facilitation in the North-South Corridor

- Quick Wins (0–6 months):
 - Launch AEO Fast-Track Cohort (20 firms) in Musina
 - Pilot pre-arrival + time-slot dispatch for two commodities
 - Publish weekly border KPIs: dwell, % pre-cleared, AEO share
- Enablers:
 - Build a truck staging hub 20–40 km south of the border
 - Form Border & Corridor Task Team with a single scorecard
- Expected Outcomes:
 - Predictable clearance for trusted traders
 - Reduced queues & logistics costs
 - Real AfCFTA utilisation & faster regional flows



Strategic Options for Limpopo: SADC + AfCFTA Regional Trade Gateway

Do Nothing / Status Quo

- No new capability, border congestion persists
- Limpopo bypassed by emerging corridors
- Jobs & investment shift to other regions

Phased / Low-Risk Entry

- Start with AEO Clinics, inland pre-clearance & staging
- Quick wins in 6–18 months, scalable to full model
- Low Capex builds confidence for PPPs

All-In: Build Full Gateway

- Full logistics ecosystem (Freight Village + Dry Port + Bonded Zone)
- High investment, high return, 3–5 yr horizon
- Positions Limpopo as a continental gateway
